

During her demo, Donna will cover 2 topics:

- Pyro Engraving: The equipment needed (both required and optional), as well as the variety of woodburning pens and tips. She will then quickly move on to show how to use them to 'carve' and create textures and patterns on flat and curved surfaces.
- Air Brushing: The equipment needed (both required and optional), as well as the types of air brushes and paints. She will then quickly move on to show how to use them to add color and patterns on flat and curved surfaces. Using painter's tape and frisket, Donna will demonstrate the use of masking to create stunning color and patterns. Most



important, Donna will show to keep your airbrush working with proper cleaning after your session is complete.
