Our own member and internationally known Woodturner, Michael Gibson will demonstrate for us how he turns a thinwalled Asian rice bowl.


Michael was a featured demonstrator at the American Association of Woodturners International Symposium in 2013 and received high honors as recipients of the "Award of Excellence" for one of his pieces. At the 2015 AAW International



Symposium, he was awarded "Master Choice" in the Merging Exhibition. He demonstrated at the 2016 AAW International Symposium in Atlanta and was awarded "People's Choice" for his piece in the Exhibition Turning 30. He was juried into a special exhibition "The Space Between" and In the exhibition "Bridging the Gap" at the 2022 AAW symposium in Chattanooga. He was juried into the special Exhibition "Out of the Woods" at the 2023 AAW Symposium in Louisville. He has demonstrated for numerous chapters of the AAW and has been feature demonstrator in several States symposiums.

Michael is in high demand as a teacher and his wonderful techniques are taught to students from around the world. During the last several years he has taught in Canada, Norway, England, Turkey, and New Zealand as well as throughout the United States. He has taught in workshops, chapter classrooms, and in private settings. His work has been published in many journals nationally and internationally.

The artwork created has garnered the attention of many collectors and has been included in corporate and private collections. His work is sought after by high end galleries and gift shops throughout the world.

July's Featured Demonstrator – Peggy Schmid Peggy will demonstrate Polymer Clay Canes

As a native Atlantan, Peggy watched the city grow from a small town into a thriving metropolis. Most of her life has been spent in and around the Atlanta area. After working in the private sector for many years, she returned to college, and at age 35, obtained a Fine Arts degree from the Atlanta College of Art (SCAD), with a major in Sculpture in 1990. It was her lifelong dream to become an artist. She also trained as an Art Educator at Georgia State University where she was an Honors Society student.

Peggy produced several major sculptural works in her career, including the Pinwheel Project for the Artist Complex, "Tula" in Buckhead, and large-scale sculptural pieces for the movie "Freejack," produced by Morgan Creek Productions. Her drawings were featured by the Gorilla Girls in Chicago and at ABC No-Rio in New York City. In 1998, she became a member of the Georgia Association of Woodturners and began her passion for Woodturning.

She is a member of the AAW and is an active member of the Etowah River Woodturners. She served as the President of The Georgia Association of Woodturners and has held several positions on the board of the Apple Ridge Woodturners. She helped establish and served as the President of the Friends of the Florida School of Woodwork, a non-profit dedicated to promoting woodworking education. Peggy demonstrates woodturning for many of the chapters in and around Georgia and is a frequent demonstrator at the tradeshows for woodworking and turning. Her work is found in private and corporate collections throughout the country.

"Artists are drawn to what they love about the art they make. I was always fascinated by the smell of fresh cut lumber in my papa's shop. Those days spent learning how to use tools and appreciating the materials were the most gratifying in my life. To this day, each time I turn a piece of pine, I am reminded of his kind and patient guidance in teaching me to work with wood. It is no wonder that I have grown into a woodturner as an artist. Each piece of wood is a new present to be opened and cherished. I am always fascinated by the surprises I find.
