
Finally a reminder to go on our webpage to register for our Holiday party in December that will include a gift exchange and Ornament competition.

October's Meeting Demonstration

Charlie Levan had been in an out of woodworking for at least the last 50 years. After retirement he really committed to woodworking as a hobby. Twelve years ago, a bowl turning course for Charlie and his Grandson Zach started his journey from woodworker to woodturner. Along the way Charlie spent time with Mark Sillay, Frank Bowers and many of the hands-on workshops that were offered through GAW and AWG. He has attended many of the Virtual symposiums that have come about since COVID.

The Demonstration tonight is inspired by Cindy Drozda's finial box demos that Charlie has seen in person and in remote demonstrations. Charlie will explain the entire process for making a box with a contrasting inlay, a lid with a finial and a foot for the box. Demonstrations will include making and installing the inlay, removing the blank for the foot, making a recess for the lid, turning the finial and other areas as time permits.

This demonstration promises to be very interesting. Don't miss it.

Looking Ahead to November - Walt Wager

For November we are blessed to have Walt Wager provide a demo for us.

Walt's undergraduate degree is in Industrial Arts from State University of New York in Oswego. After teaching high school shop he attended Indiana University and earned a doctoral degree in Instructional Systems Design. Walt started woodturning upon his retirement from Florida State University in 2002. Since then, he has taught and demonstrated woodturning techniques regionally, nationally, and internationally.


What Walt loves about woodturning is that it is a creative, problem-solving process. Every piece of wood is different and requires a variety of techniques to form and finish. He mostly uses regional woods from the southern U.S., including cherry, camphor, magnolia, maple, palm, and sycamore. Walt has published over a dozen articles in the American Association of Woodworkers Journals, American Woodturner, and Fundamentals, and the British Magazine, Woodturning.

Walt's demo will cover Elegant Native American Hollow Forms Turning small hollow-forms - Demonstrating the use of small hand-held hollowing tools to make small hollow-forms suitable for Native American pottery shapes - they make great canvases for embellishments. More over here.

AWG Member Tim Robertson has announced that he has finished designing AWG name badges that can be ordered and purchased by any AWG member. These badges are laser cut and engraved on 1/8" thick prefinished maple plywood made for laser engraving. They are held in place using magnetic badge attachments. Replacing traditional badge pins, badge magnets are clothes-friendly: no more pin holes or possible tears on your clothes.

Here are the details of the name badges:

- Material: 1/8" thick maple plywood which is finished with a furniture-grade semi-gloss finish.
- Size: 3-1/2" x 2".
- > Engraving: Laser cut and engraved.
- The cost for each badge is just \$10.00 in cash. To make the process as smooth as possible, you have two convenient options to order your badge:
- 1. Reply to this email before the August 16th AWG regular monthly meeting, advising me you would like a name badge and exactly how your name should appear on the badge. I will furnish Tim with a list of names, and Tim will take care of the rest including collecting your \$10 when he gives you the badge.
- 2. **Direct Ordering: Alternatively, club members can also reach out to Tim directly via text (C) 770-634-6604 or email tb.robertson@gmail.com, specifying the name you want on the badge, and he will be more than happy to personalize it accordingly.

Note: Tim does not accept verbal or handwritten names, He copies directly from text or email and paste them into the program so there are no errors in spelling of names.

If you purchase the name badge, you will keep it and bring back and forth to our meetings. If you forget your badge or choose not to buy a badge, please continue to fill out a disposable name tag at each meeting.


